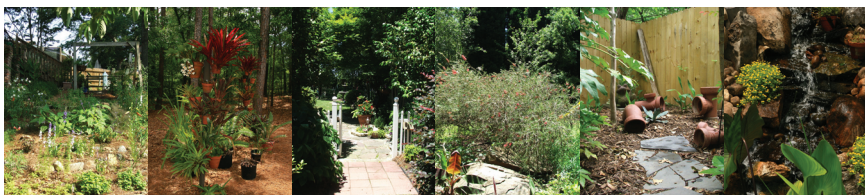

## *20th Anniversary SCMMGA Gardening Symposium*

Your Grandmother's favorite rose. Spring rain. Slamming wooden screen door. Lightning bugs. Lizards. Butterflies. Re-blooming zinnias. Snap dragons. Praying mantis. Victory gardens. Daddy longlegs. Honey bees. How many other memories do you have of gardens of old?

The theme of the 20th Anniversary South Carolina Midlands Master Gardeners Association Gardening Symposium is *Southern Garden Memories*. This year's symposium will include topics about passalong plants, critters (good, bad and missing) and fragrance. Along with these topics, we will touch on cost effective measures for our gardens and how using some of the methods our ancestors used could benefit us today.

Main speakers for the day are Bryce Lane and Jenks Farmer. Bryce is a Lecturer and Undergraduate Coordinator with the Department of Horticultural Science at the North Carolina State University. Bryce is also the host of "In the Garden" television program on UNC TV on Saturday's at noon. It is an introductory gardening show for the home gardener. Jenks is currently the curator and designer of the Moore Farms, one the most horticulturally sophisticated private gardens in the state - a 25 acre garden with a staff of 9 horticulturists. Additionally he is the curator and designer of the owner's Victorian era garden and cycad collection in Charleston. Lushlife Nursery is a small family operated nursery owned by Jenks, his partner, Tom Hall, and two nephews. Both of these men are nationally recognized and are experts in many aspects of gardens and gardening.

Our concurrent speakers are Bill Patterson of Roses Unlimited, Andy Cabe of Riverbanks Zoo and Botanical Garden, and Richard Hager of Monticello Gardens. Bill started growing roses (Jean Bach Sisley) obtained from his great-grandmother's garden while in grammar school. Through Clemson University Bill became a Master Gardener and because of dedicated rose growers became an ARS consulting rosarian, an accredited ARS horticulture judge (1998) and then an ARS arrangement judge (2000). Andy is the Botanical Garden Director at Riverbanks Zoo and Garden. Andy received a degree in Ornamental Horticulture from Clemson University in 1997. While he is fond of many different plants, bulbs are his primary passion. Richard owns Monticello Gardens in Jenkinsville.

Lush Life Nurseries, McKenzie Farms and Nursery, Mill Creek Greenhouses, and Shady Characters Nursery are just some of the plant vendors who will have plants for purchase. Creative Snail Mail, Michael Bell, Jimmy Dinkins, Linda Fraser, Richard Fugel of Kombi Garden Tools, Mrs. Artsy Fartsy, Lisa Rivers of Leaves by Lisa & Southern Living at Home, Ginny Sherman of Live Oaks Farm, The Weavers' Nook by Mary Graham-Grant, and Betsy Winn are artisans who will also have beautiful and unusual art objects for purchase.

The day should be full of useful information and great buys. Remember that space is limited so buy your tickets soon so that you don't miss out on this wonderful opportunity.
